Using Patient Placement Criteria (ASAM PPC-2R) (CD-Rom)

Managed care companies, treatment providers, and program evaluators use patient placement criteria to ensure that clients are placed in the appropriate level of care. This course will examine the patient placement criteria for clients with substance use disorders adopted by the American Society of Addiction Medicine (ASAM). Admission, continued stay ,and discharge criteria for adults and adolescents will be reviewed. Case studies will be utilized to help participants in applying the principles of placement criteria.

- ◆ This is an introductory course. No prior background in ASAM PPC-2R is required.

Clinical Supervision (CD-Rom)

Supervision of clinical personnel has been called “meta-therapy” by some practitioners. Effective clinical supervisors are well-trained in psychotherapy, management and supervision techniques specific to counselors. Many individuals in the counseling field are promoted to clinical supervision with little formal training in clinical supervision.

This course will provide an overview of clinical supervision theories and skills. Additionally, clinical supervision of addiction counselors will be highlighted. This course provides an excellent review for “seasoned” clinical supervisors as well as providing neophyte clinical supervisors with a solid foundation.

Evidence-Based Treatment Approaches (CD-Rom)

NIDA’s publication, *Principles of Drug Addiction Treatment*, forms the basis of this course. Participants will be exposed to research-based addiction treatment approaches for outpatient, short-term residential and long-term residential programs. Each approach reviewed addresses certain aspects of a drug addiction and its consequences for the individual, family and society.

Methadone Maintenance Treatment — Facts, Myths, and Special Problems in this Population (CD-Rom)

This course will give the clinician the opportunity to learn more about the complex disease of opiate addiction and the most widely used treatment in our nation currently – methadone maintenance. The medical aspects of pharmacotherapy with methadone, methadone maintenance treatment practices, facts and myths about methadone treatment and laws/regulations of methadone treatment will be covered. Special topics in this specified treatment will also be discussed including needle exchange programs, HIV/AIDS, communicable diseases, and criminal justice involvement.

Current websites and literature will also be discussed on the current controversies of methadone treatment and politics.
