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NEVADA ALCOHOL AND DRUG ABUSE COUNSELOR REQUIREMENTS

Licensed/ Certified Counselors

Nevada Administrative Code 641C (NAC 641C.300) requires that all licensed or certified alcohol and drug counselors earn 40 hours of continuing education hours during a two-year period of licensure or certification, of which three hours must pertain to ethics and three hours must pertain to confidentiality and HIPAA.

Clinical Supervisors

Licensed counselors who supervise certified interns must attend at least ten hours of continuing education in counseling supervision, ethics, and Nevada law during the two-year certification period. These hours may be included in the required 40 hours of continuing education.

Interns

Registered counselor interns are required to earn 15 hours of training within the first six months of their internship employment, ten hours during the second six months, and 20 hours in each subsequent year. During the first three months, six hours of continuing education credits must pertain to ethics and six hours must pertain to confidentiality and HIPAA.

Record Keeping

Participants who need contact hours for alcohol and drug counseling licensure, certification, or internship must have proof of attendance (Certificate of Completion) for possible audit by the Nevada Board of Examiners for Alcohol, Drug and Gambling Counselor's office.

Participants are reminded that maintenance of contact hour records, certificates, etc., is the responsibility of the individual and not CASAT nor the Board of Examiners.

Social Work CEUs

Pursuant to NAC 641B.189 (NRS 641B.280) and the Nevada Board of Examiners for Social Workers, a licensee may only take up to 7.5 hours of continuing education credits via distance learning/remote study courses, home study and/or self-directed learning programs during a two-year period.

The area of study dedicated to cognitive impairment resulting from substance abuse is very new. Some studies suggest that 30-80% of clients entering treatment may have significant cognitive impairment which limits their ability to benefit from typical programs (Aharonovich et al., 2003; Fals-Stewart, 1996; & Grossman, 2003). CD-ROM WORKSHOPS

Earn CEHs by CD-ROM

Earn continuing education hours through home study using CASAT's CD-ROM version of online workshops. Agencies or groups may purchase a CD-ROM and have more than one person earn continuing education hours with the same CD-ROM. The purchase of a CD-ROM includes one certificate (eight continuing education hours). If the agency or group wants additional people to earn continuing education hours with the CD-ROM, an additional \$20.00 fee is required per person. How it Works

The CD-ROM is set up to allow individuals to complete all reading and writing assignments at their own pace. Reading and writing assignments usually require eight hours of work. Individuals will need access to a computer with Windows 95, 98, ME or XP, a CD-ROM drive, and Internet access to complete these workshops. Eight CEHs are available for each CD-ROM workshop.

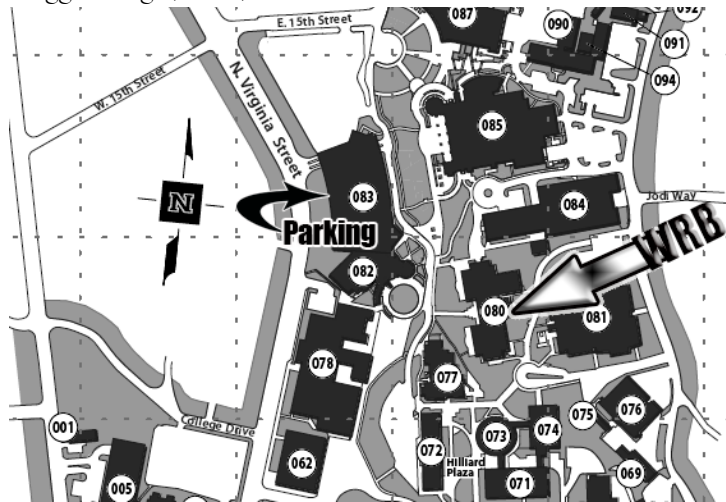

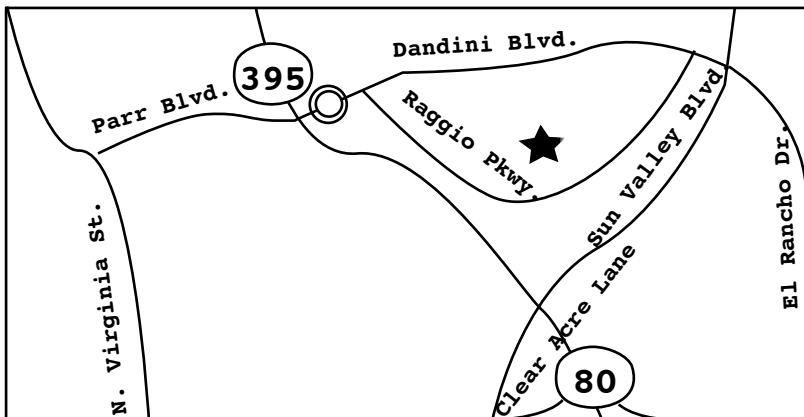

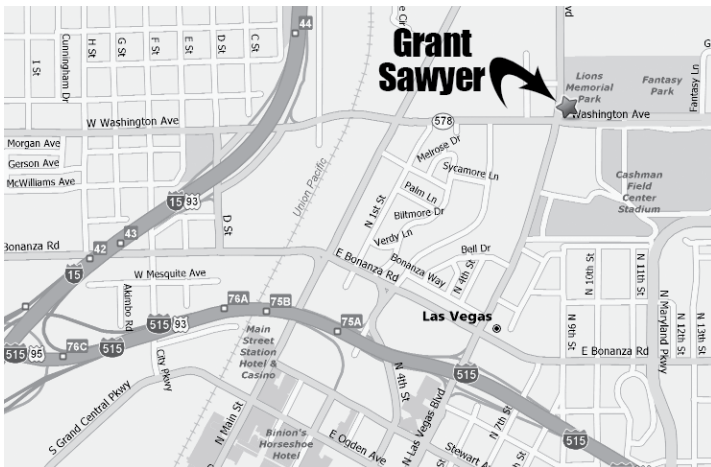
