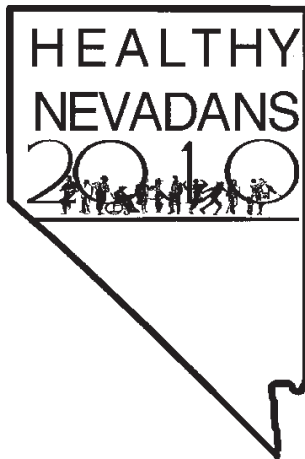

Online Course Information

Online Basics

All online courses will run for four weeks. In order to take an online course, participants will need:

- ◆ Familiarity with web browsers and the World Wide Web
- ◆ A working, valid e-mail address (not shared with someone else)
- ◆ Computer with Internet access
- ◆ One of the following Internet web browsers on your computer:
 - ◇ Internet Explorer 4 or higher
 - ◇ Netscape 7 or higher
 - ◇ Mozilla 1.2 or higher
 - ◇ Apple Safari 1.0 or higher
- ◆ Microsoft Word (or Word compatible program, such as OpenOffice.org)

The course is conducted entirely on the Internet. Homework is submitted via the course website.

Registration and Course Fees

Participants will register for an online course by completing the workshop registration form at the end of this catalog. The cost for an online course is \$40.00. There are no special rates for the online courses. Registrants must pay the course fee before starting the course.

How it works

After registering for the course, an e-mail confirmation will be sent to each individual just prior to the first week of the course. The confirmation includes the following information:

- ◆ Dates of the course
- ◆ Enrollment 'key' for the course
- ◆ Instructions for enrolling in the course
- ◆ E-mail address of the course instructor

With the confirmation e-mail, you will be able to visit the online courses website (<http://casat.unr.edu/moodle/>) and create an account for yourself. Once you have

created the account, you can use the enrollment key to enter the course for which you registered.

Note: If you have taken another online course using this system before, you do not need to create a new account. You can simply use your previous login information and the new enrollment key to enter the course.

Coursework

The first week of the course allows students to familiarize themselves with the online course system. This includes learning to use the online discussion forum, posting a message to this forum to facilitate student introductions, and then taking a pre-evaluation quiz.

During the fourth (last) week of the course an online post-evaluation survey is offered to provide feedback regarding the online course. Course certificates will not be mailed until the participant completes the post-evaluation.

Participants in online courses can expect approximately one hour of reading and one hour of homework (answering essay type questions) per week for four weeks. Some instructors may have participants visit certain websites as part of homework assignments.

All homework assignments must be completed in order for the participant to earn contact hours. Homework assignments must be completed on a weekly basis. Pre- and post-tests will be administered with each online course.

Contact Hours

Each online course will be worth 8 contact hours. Completed and submitted homework assignments are the mechanisms used to grant contact hours. CASAT will issue certificates to participants who complete and submit all homework assignments. Participants who complete some but not all homework assignments will not be issued a certificate or given a reduced number of contact hours (CEHs). Participants who do not complete homework assignments will not be given a refund.

CD-Rom Workshops

Earn CEHs by CD-Rom

You can earn continuing education hours through home study of CASAT's CD-Rom version of online workshops. Agencies or groups may purchase a CD-Rom and have more than one person earn continuing education hours with the same CD-Rom. The purchase of a CD-Rom includes one certificate (8 continuing education hours). If the agency or group wants additional people to earn continuing education hours with the CD-Rom, an additional \$20.00 fee is required per person.

How it works

The CD-Rom is set up to allow individuals to complete all reading and writing assignments at their own pace. Reading and writing assignments usually require eight hours of work. Individuals will need access to a computer with Windows 95, 98, ME or XP, a CD-Rom drive, and Internet access to complete these workshops. Eight CEHs are available for each CD-Rom workshop.

Clinical Supervision

CD-Rom

Supervision of clinical personnel has been called “meta-therapy” by some practitioners. Effective clinical supervisors are well-trained in psychotherapy, management, and supervision techniques specific to counselors. Many individuals in the counseling field are promoted to clinical supervision with little formal training in clinical supervision.

This course will provide an overview of clinical supervision theories and skills. Additionally, clinical supervision of addiction counselors will be highlighted. This course provides an excellent review for “seasoned” clinical supervisors as well as providing neophyte clinical supervisors with a solid foundation.

Nevada Alcohol and Drug Abuse Counselor Requirements

Licensed/Certified Counselors Nevada Administrative Code 641C (NAC 641C.300) requires that all licensed or certified alcohol and drug counselors earn 40 hours of continuing education during a two year period of licensure or certification. Three hours of continuing educations credits must pertain to ethics and three hours must pertain to confidentiality and HIPAA.

Clinical Supervisors Licensed counselors who supervise certified interns must attend at least ten hours of continuing education in counseling supervision, ethics, and Nevada law during the two year certification period. These hours may be included in the required 40 hours of continuing education.

Interns Registered counselor interns are required to earn 15 hours of training in the first six months, ten hours during the second six months and 20 hours in each subsequent year. During the first three months, six hours of continuing educations credits must pertain to ethics and 6 hours must pertain to confidentiality and HIPAA.

Record-keeping Participants who need contact hours for alcohol and drug counseling licensure, certification, or internship must have proof of attendance (certificate of completion) for possible audit by the Nevada Board of Examiners for Alcohol, Drug and Gambling Counse-

lors office. Participants are reminded that maintenance of contact hour records, certificates, etc., is the responsibility of the individual and not CASAT or the Board of Examiners.
