Using Patient Placement Criteria (ASAM PPC-2R) (Videotape or DVD)

Managed care companies, treatment providers, and program evaluators use patient placement criteria to ensure that clients are placed in the appropriate level of care. This training will examine the patient placement criteria for clients with substance use disorders adopted by the American Society of Addiction Medicine (ASAM). Admission, continued stay,

and discharge criteria for adults and adolescents will be reviewed. Case studies will be utilized to help participants in applying the principles of placement criteria.

This workshop is appropriate for addiction counselors, especially individuals preparing for the oral licensure or certification exam. Social workers, marriage and family therapists, and probation/parole officers may wish to take this workshop as they frequently encounter patient placement criteria issues when seeking placement for their clients.
